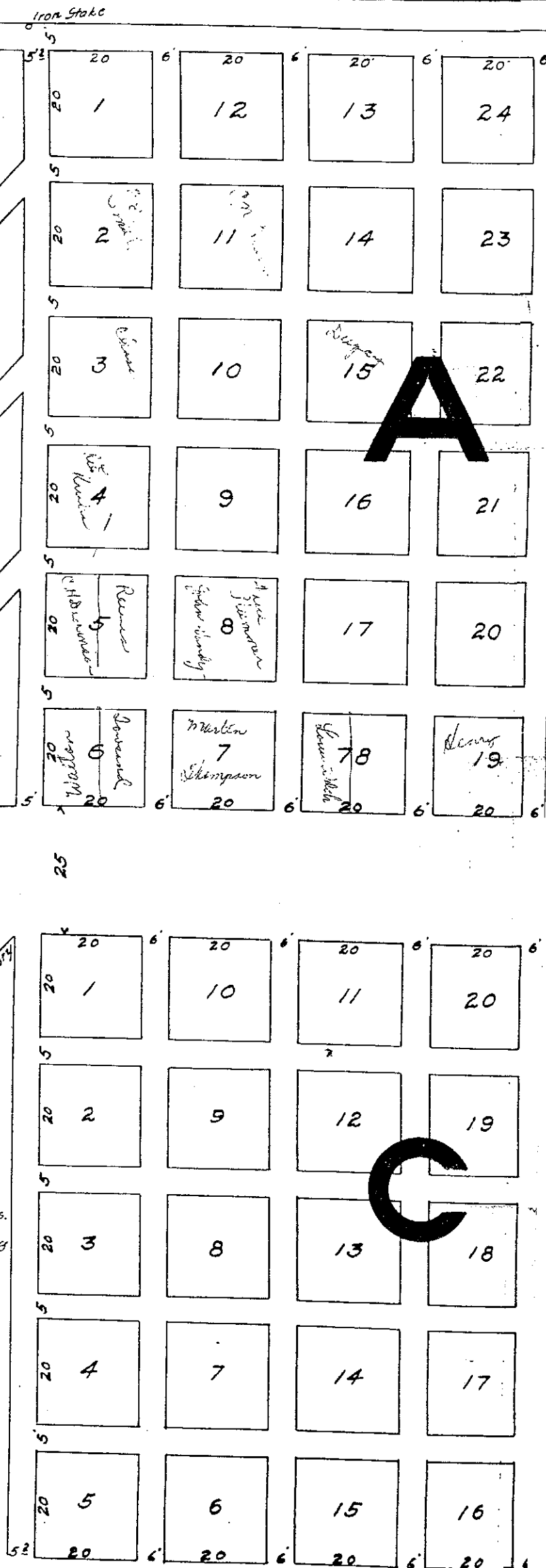
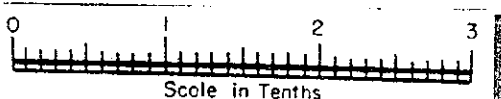

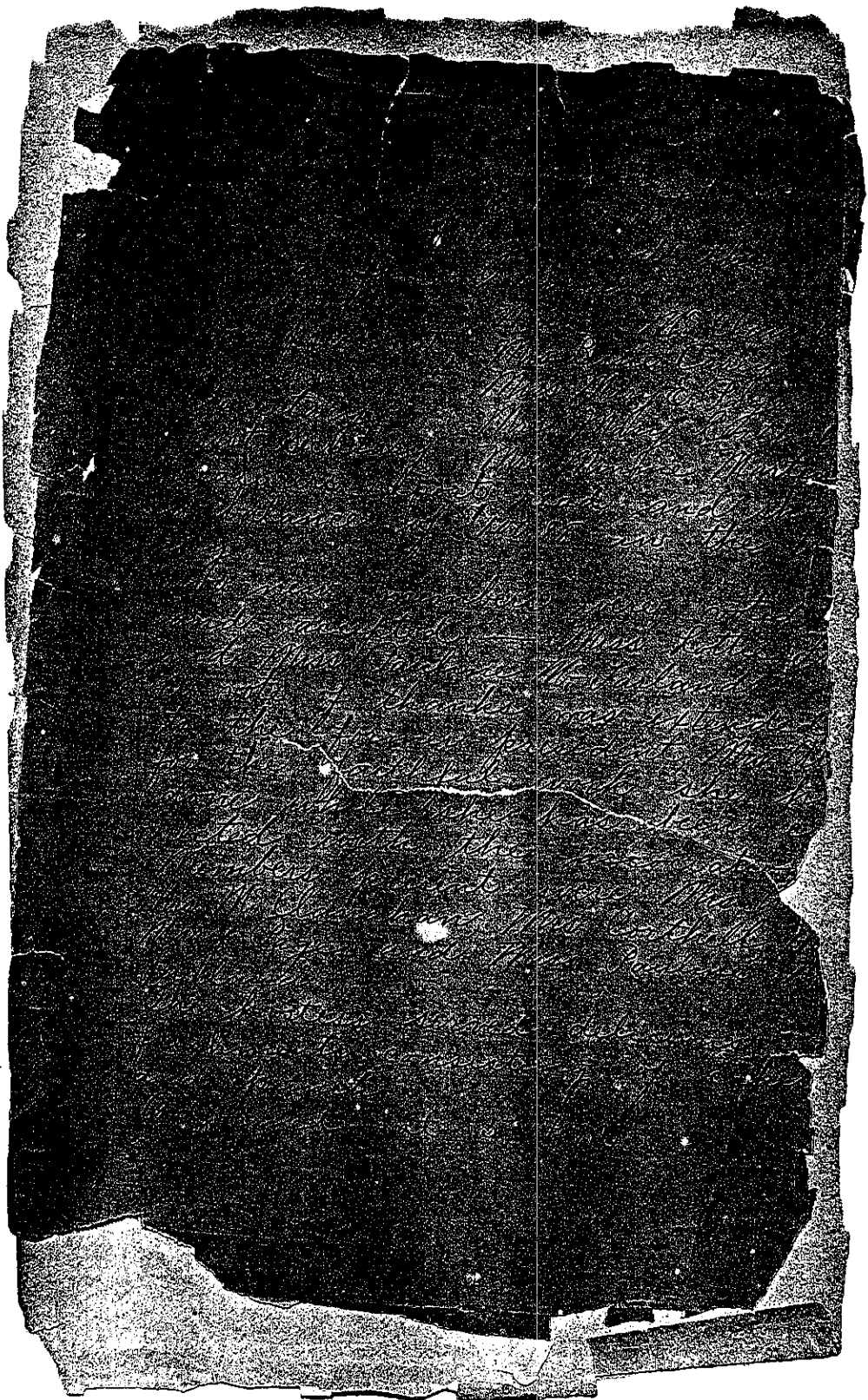

off the graves etc. with wood-
blocks put first, to be replaced with
cement posts later.

etry, asking them if they will
assist us in repairing damages
done by the storm.
